

Plant-A-Tree Formerly known as Penny Pines

Fact Sheet

Your Garden Club can participate in a meaningful and practical conservation project by contributing a minimum of \$50.00 to the Plant-A-Tree Reforestation and Forest Education Program. National Garden Club partnered with USDA Forest Service use your contribution for sustaining our National forests through this program. All contributions are used to plant trees and restore the national forest where forests are badly impacted by wildfires, flooding, drought and other forest disturbances.

You may choose to have your donation go where it's most needed or you may select a National Forest you wish to have benefit from your donation; however, the Forest Service reserves the right to choose where the contribution is to be used based on need. Under a conservation agreement, the Forest Service will do the planting, using your donation together with federal funds, and will provide to the plantation the same protection from fires, insects, and disease given other forested areas.

The plantations are a part of the regular national forest reforestation program planted on burned-over and brush-covered areas that are potentially productive timberlands. These plantations provide soil protection, watershed protection, soil stabilization, future harvestable timber, as well as beauty and shade for recreation.

For each \$50.00 contribution, you will receive a Plant-A-Tree Certificate from National Garden Clubs, Inc. Your Club's contribution may be made in honor or in memory of ONE individual, organization, or theme. (Certificates will be issued according to information listed on the form below).
